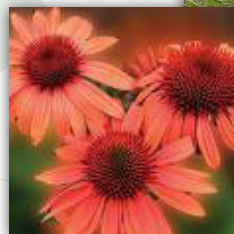
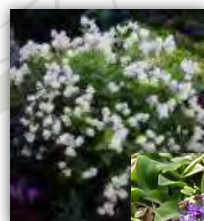
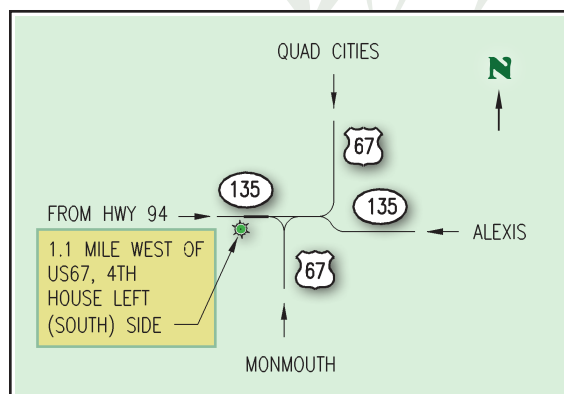

- Drought tolerant after they are established (one year)
- Cold tolerant, even in years without snow cover and cold temps
- Excellent for erosion control due to their extensive root system
- Naturally resistant to many pests and diseases
- Provide nectar, pollen and seed for bees, butterflies and birds
- Provide nesting sites
- Fairly low maintenance once established
- Help open up tight soils so water can penetrate, reducing runoff
- Plants for the toughest conditions, dry shade, wet soils, very dry soils, and heavy clay
